AFRICAN LEADERS FOR BLACK EMPOWERMENT



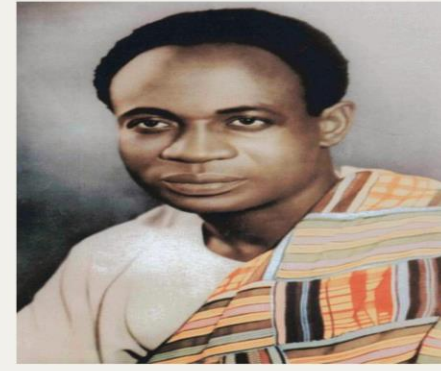
Muammar Mohammed Abu Minyar Gaddafi, commonly known as Colonel Gaddafi, was a Libyan revolutionary, politician and political theorist.
Born: 7 June 1942 **Assassinated:** 20 October 2011
Net worth: US\$200 billion (2011, est.)

- Per Capita rose to more than \$11 000
- Plan to shut-down the American & British Military Basis in Libya
- Demanded that foreign oil co in Libya share a bigger portion of Revenue with Libya
- Plan Detach his oil sales from dollar
- Plan to introduce Tehran Oil Bourse (ruined by George Bush)
- New plan for Africa would have meant an entirely new BANKING system for Africa, away from the Western Central Banks that dominates African currencies, this would have meant the collapse of the US dollar
- He wanted to empower Africa. He had a plan to create a New African Union, based on a New African Economic System
- He had a plan to introduce the 'GOLD DINAR' as a backing for African Currencies



Thomas Isidore Noël Sankara was a Burkinabé militant social justice campaigner and President of Burkina Faso from 1983 to 1987. He was viewed by supporters as a charismatic and iconic figure of revolution
Born: 21/12/1949, **Assassinated:** 15 /10/1987

- He initiated a nation-wide literacy campaign, increasing the literacy rate from 13% in 1983 to 73% in 1987
- He opposed foreign aid, saying that "he who feeds you, controls you"
- He built roads and a railway to tie the nation together, without foreign aid
- He appointed females to high governmental positions, encouraged them to work, recruited them into the military, and granted pregnancy leave during education
- He vaccinated 2.5 million children against meningitis, yellow fever and measles in a matter of weeks.

Kwame Nkrumah PC was a Ghanaian politician and revolutionary. He was the first Prime Minister and President of Ghana, having led the Gold Coast to independence from Britain in 1957.
Born: 21 September 1909 **Died:** 27 April 1972

- funded national industrial and energy projects
- Developed a strong national education system
- Promoted a pan-Africanist culture
- Under Nkrumah, Ghana played a leading role in African international relations during the decolonization period
- Reversing Africa's Colonial Balkanisation to reunify the African Continental a single pan-Africanist, a union of African State so can compete economically



Marcus Garvey was a Jamaican-born black nationalist and leader of the Pan-Africanism movement, which sought to unify and connect people of African descent worldwide with a Plan of returning to Africa.
Born: 17 August 1887, **Died:** 10 June 1940

- Taught black self empowerment to Nigros (African American)
- Built Factories
- formed a movement called Universal Nigro improvement Association
- He built a hotel
- He built a chain of grocery stores
- His organization had their own trucking company
- He built schools
- He built restaurants
- His organization had their own printing press
- He started 3 newspapers
- Bought 5 ships & started practicing international trade and commerce
- Owned office buildings & also bought an auditorium in New York
- By 1922, he had 6 million members branches in 40 countries
- Marcus Garvey did all of that without help from the Government, and he did it with an 8th grade education

In 2011 the late Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe criticised the decision made by African countries that voted in favour of a resolution by western countries to invade Libya resulting in the killing of Libyan long time leader Muammar Gaddafi.

THE BLACK ENSLAVED MIND



One of the biggest damages caused by colonialism, was to mentally enslave the black person. The project of mental slavery was well executed. Black people today view each other as fellow slaves and see the white person as superior and the only one capable to lead, therefore black people must submit to the white master.

The project was systematically inculcated in black people's mind that whenever one of them - whatever the number - rise to lead, they must never gain the loyalty and support from their fellow black people. Hence, the current status is that whenever a white person and a black person individually but simultaneously establish an Enterprise, black people will automatically gravitate towards supporting the white person's Enterprises. However, if a black person does the same thing and open an Enterprise, we (black

people) are reluctant to support that Enterprise, instead we will want to compete with that black person because the mind-set of a black person says "if that slave did it, so can I."

We have witnessed this kind of attitude in our communities in townships, where the black person cannot tolerate to see another person prosper. For instance, one neighbour would embark on a project to remodel their home and because of a poor mind the other neighbour will also want to remodel their home, not because it is necessary to do so, but because they cannot stand to see another black person succeed.

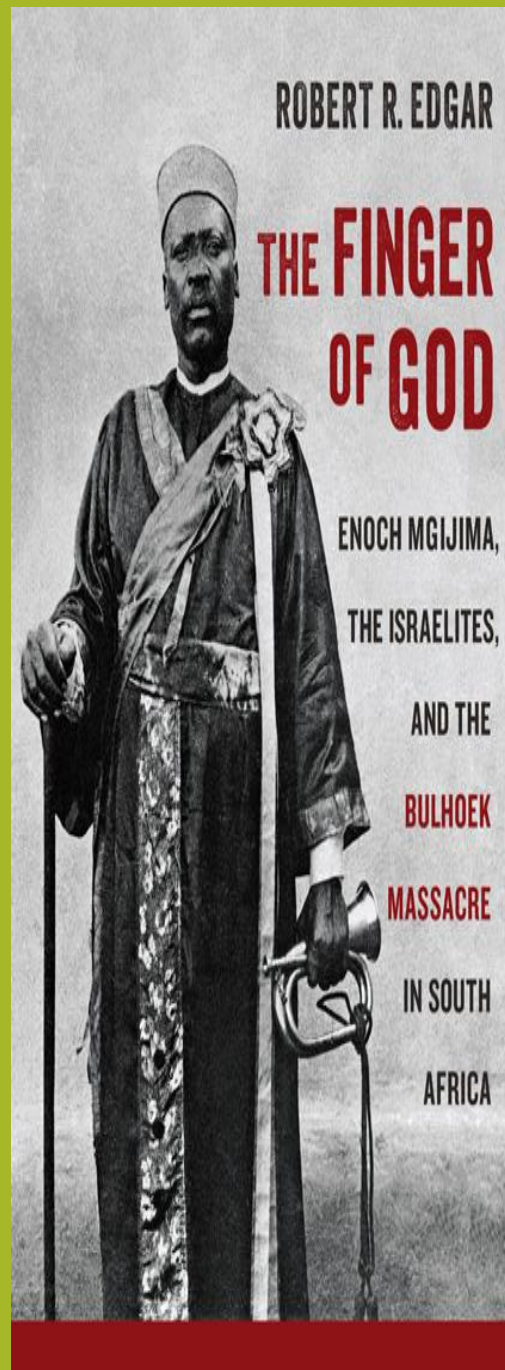
Because of this mentality, many black leaders across different fields do not succeed with their mission of liberating Black people because of the tempered mentality.

Prophet Vusamazulu Credo Mutwa...

- The Prophet believed in the mental liberation of the black person, thus his creation of a Youth Academy aimed at decolonising and restoring the young minds back to Africanism
- Wrote books about African spirituality
- Erected cultural villages for the purpose of eradicating Western doctrinal education
- ...



Prophet Enoch Mgijima

- He wanted to develop his own place with his people separate from the cruelties of the country
- according to his followers, the call led to a pilgrimage, with followers from all over South Africa – about 3 000 people – arriving at Ntabelanga
- Some historians believe that the Israelites were the victims of the segregationist government, as their struggle was a fight for land and exemption from taxes, as well as self-rule to end White oppression.
- In July the headman of Kamastone complained to Nightingale that more Israelites were arriving and more houses were being built.
- This time Mgijima avoided contact with Nightingale. The Inspector had lost all trust in Mgijima and he began trying other ways of removing the squatters from Ntabelanga
- The Prophet wanted to develop his economic system that would benefit his people and give them separate independence from the government
- He achieved to setup an ECONOMY of BLACKS amongst his own people whilst residing at Ntabelanga
- He was arrested whilst injured during the Massacre and subjected to hard labour. He died shortly after being released
